Doosan Forklift Parts - Doosan Infracore Company Ltd. is an intercontinental company consisting of Diesel Engines, Defense Industry products, Industrial Vehicles, Construction Technologies and Machine Instruments and Automation Systems.

Their United States partner, Doosan Infracore America Corporation, based in Suwanee, Georgia houses a 170,000 square foot production facility, home to a Compact Equipment and Construction division. Cleveland, Ohio houses the Lift Truck division, and West Caldwell, New Jersey has a Machine Tool division. The U.S. headquarters in Georgia facilitates a first rate parts operation capable of supplying an excess of 25,000 line items to support Lift Truck, Compact Equipment, Machine Tool and Construction client wishes.

With a system consisting of over 90 independent dealers, the lift truck group provides quality materials handling equipment to the wide-ranging North American market. Doosan Infracore America Lift Truck dealers successfully operate in over 220 service and product sales locations throughout Canada and the U.S. The lift truck product line remarkably includes 63 different products consisting of 82 various battery and engine configurations of Electric-powered and Internal Combustion lift trucks. Capacities of these numerous truck models vary from 3,000 to 33,000 lbs. All vehicles are built in an ISO 9001 certified facility.

Doosan Infracore America is the fastest rising forklift and lift truck corporation in the North American marketplace, due to its excellent level of product performance and their persistently high level of buyer support and service given to all Doosan Infracore Forklift clients. The U.S. lift Truck division stationed in Cleveland has a professional team knowledgeable in Product Sales, Purchasing, Advertising, Logistical and Technical Support.

Korea's original home-based lift truck market was an open-import enterprise. In the 1960's, Korea Machinery Co. Ltd. started to import assembled lift trucks as part of a nationwide machinery expansion venture. Initial sales of this industrialized equipment focused on large business communities, the armed forces and on state-run companies. This eventually led to a merger with Daewoo Heavy Industries Ltd. In 1976, the Forklift Division commenced business operations throughout Korea to service and sell this heavy equipment. By 1978, a lift truck production plant was successfully completed. Continuous technical education grew to become the new focus for improving quality and product development.

Home-based lift truck business for Daewoo started in 1967 and grew to an astonishing 90% market share in Korea. By the 1980's, Daewoo's advanced technological enhancements combined with sales success placed them in a situation of significant expansion of their lift truck business.

In 1981, Caterpillar Industrial Inc. of the United States, proposed a cooperative venture project to respond to competitive pressures in the US materials handling market. This plan radically expanded Daewoo's lift truck sales. Construction was completed in 1984 to facilitate a contemporary plant which helped launch the business for the fabrication of high end added-value goods suited for export. In 1993, the company had a international sales network and started exporting designs they had established through in-house expertise, as an sovereign brand. Certifications were then acquired from CE of Europe, UL of the United States and ISO 14001 and ISO 9001, securing expansion possibilities into overseas marketplaces.
